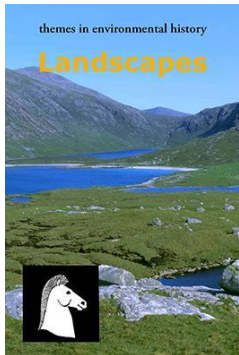




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***Landscapes***

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*Landscapes* explores the conceptualization of environments as landscape, philosophically and historically. Excursions in landscape aesthetics contextualize case studies of landscapes perceived, constructed, and responded to, from the plantations of South Africa to the Australian outback, the medieval Ardennes to nuclear-age America. Literary and artistic versions of landscape are studied alongside those driven by policy and pragmatism, probing the intersections of the transcendent and the ideological.

Each volume aims to cover a prominent subject in the discipline, combining theoretical chapters and case studies.
