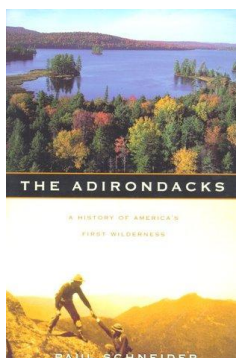

The Adirondack Mountains are where masses of non-Native Americans first learned to cherish the wilderness as a place of recreation and solace.
