In this issue of *Earth First! Journal*, Judi Bari gives an update on the lawsuit against FBI for its handling of the 1990 car bombing; Judi Bari and Darryl Cherney's car were bombed and they were both arrested for terrorism activities.

Traditionally the word *baud* in the Thai language refers to a Buddhist ceremony that men undergo to signify their entrance into monkhood. Now the adapted ceremony *baud bah* (which means "ordained forest") is used to raise environmental awareness and teach all Thai about the value of forests by ordaining trees. In the *baud bah* monks pray and wrap saffron robes around the trunks of trees to declare their sacredness. *Baud bah* has worked well because most Thais deeply respect the saffron robe. In short, nobody would dare cut the sanctified trees out of respect for the saffron robe and its inextricable link with Buddhism.
